

36 medals were awarded to Stone Ridge French students for *Le Grand Concours* 2010

Upper School: 19 medals
Middle School: 17 medals

Le Grand Concours is an annual competition sponsored by the American Association of Teachers of French. Stone Ridge students in grades 8-12 participated in this French National Contest, along with others from all 50 states and abroad.

Students take a written test which includes listening & reading comprehension and grammar. The state of Maryland awards prizes such as books, DVDs, CDs and pins to the first ten ranking students in the state. Medals are given only at the National Level to the top ten scores in the United States. Gold medals are awarded only for a perfect score, and silver medals to students with one or two mistakes i.e. between the 97th and 99th percentiles. Bronze medals are given to students who have between 3 and 9 mistakes.

Over 100,000 students nationwide participated in *Le Grand Concours* in 2010.
